In accordance with the Constitution of Thirroul Surf Lifesaving Inc, (The Club) the Committee of the Club hereby gives notice and invites all members to attend the AGM to be conducted at the Club Function Room on Sunday 13 August 2023 at 2.00 PM.

The Committee wishes to draw member's attention to the Constitution in respect of the conduction of the meeting and specifically the eligibility for voting in accordance with Clause 8.2 of the Constitution.

Standard Motions

Motion 1

In line with Branch and SLSNSW requirements, we pass a motion that affiliation be sought for the 2023-24 season with SLS Illawarra / NSW. Further, that the articles, constitution, by-laws, regulations and resolutions, together with the awards and equipment of Surf Life Saving Australia Limited and/or affiliated State / Territory Centres and/or Branches, be accepted without reservation.

Motion 2

That Thirroul SLSC's Membership fees for the 2023/24 season will be:

- **All members: \$75 per person** (at least one adult member must join for each junior member)
- **Gym membership: \$450**
 - The gym is for financial members only and the fee is exclusive of membership
 - Patrollers, directors and principal office bearers get complimentary gym membership (principal offices bearers are those recorded in SurfGuard including Age Managers)
- **Swipe key: \$30**

Motion 3

That Thirroul SLSC's Competition Levy for the 2023-24 season will be:

- **All Competitors: \$75 per competitor**

Motion 4

That Thirroul SLSC's storage fee for any non-active member:

- **Each personal surf/paddle/rescue board/ski: \$150 per year**

Further Special Resolutions and Motions

A number of motions put forward at the AGM require a “Special Resolution”, in accordance with the Associations Incorporation Act - 2009 (NSW) in order to amend the Club Constitution. A Special Resolution requires the approval of 75% (or more) of the eligible members voting at a General Meeting. In addition a number of other motions are submitted for approval at the General Meeting, but only require a simple majority of eligible voters to pass.

Special Resolution 1

That Clause 18.2 (Composition of the Board) of the Thirroul SLSC Constitution be changed to include the addition of a new Director position, i.e. Director of Member Services. Such change to be included as point (i) Director of Member Services.

Notes: Refer to Position Description, to be incorporated in the Thirroul SLSC By-Laws, for a description of the Member Services role. The aim of this change is to broaden the administrative workload on the current board and to allow this position to focus on the important areas covered by the role description. This change also aligns with SLSA, State and Branch structures.

Special Resolution 2

That Clause 8.2 (Categories of Members) of the Thirroul SLSC be amended to include the categories of: “Past Active Members”, “Leave/Restricted Members”, “Community Members” in line with SLSA and Surf Guard.

Notes: Refer to the Draft Thirroul SLSC Policy “Guideline to Thirroul SLSC Membership Categories” for a description of the new membership categories. The intent of this proposed change is to bring the Thirroul SLSC Constitution into line with the SLSA, SLS NSW and Branch constitutions. The additional membership categories also provide opportunities for the Club/Board to manage the increasingly diverse range of members joining SLSCs.

Motion 5

That the following changes, required to the Thirroul By-Laws to facilitate the inclusion of the “Director of Member Services” onto the Thirroul SLSC Board of Directors, be accepted:

Clause 7, Duties of Board Officers (Directors of the Board) include new Sub-clause 7.9 to include “Director of Member Services” with the following duties:

- a. Member of Board (Board)
- b. Manage the programs, policies, training and resources relating to Member Services as determined by SLSNSW
- c. Coordinate the recognition of members for Club service awards (Life Member, Honorary Member, Long Service Member, Reserve Active Member, milestone service awards)
- d. Coordinate Illawarra Branch and State awards nominations.
- e. Coordinate the recognition of members through external awards such as local community awards and Australia Day
- f. Work with Club Historian to ensure historical records are captured for the season.
- g. Work with Youth Development Officer to develop and maintain youth and development programs
- h. Develop and maintain recruitment and retention programs in consultation with relevant personnel, Branch and SLSNSW

- i. Develop and maintain member protection information in consultation with relevant personnel, Branch and SLSNSW
- j. Coordinate Member Protection Information Officer training and maintain database as required
- k. Liaise with Support Officers to monitor member services programs
- l. Provide timely reports to Executive Committee on member services programs as required
- m. Assist in grant proposals and other funding opportunities to support Club priorities Representation & engagement.
- n. Other duties as assigned.

Motion 6

That the Thirroul SLSC By-Laws include a Gym Sub-Committee in Section 6 Sub Committees, Section 6.2, Roles, a new sub clause 6.2.7 Gym Sub Committee, with the following description:

A minimum of three members will be elected at the Annual General Meeting or appointed by the Board. The role of the Sub Committee is to advise and make recommendations to the Board about, and to coordinate any works relating to, the Thirroul SLSC Gym.

Notes: This motion seeks to formally recognise the Gym Sub Committee in the Thirroul SLSC By Laws.

Motion 7

That the proposed “Guideline to Thirroul SLSC Membership Categories” Policy be adopted.

Notes: This policy sets out to clarify eligibility, rights and responsibilities for each Membership Category as defined in the Thirroul Constitution. This document does NOT replace either the Constitution or By Laws, which remain the governing documents for Thirroul SLSC. A full copy of the policy can be found below.

Motion 8

That Thirroul SLSC recognizes the position of “UAV Officer”. “UAV Officer” to be included in the list of official Committee roles in the Thirroul SLSC By Laws.

Notes: This motion recognises that UAV’s (Drones) are an emerging rescue tool for Surf Clubs. SLSI is looking to roll out drones to all Illawarra Surf Clubs over the next two seasons. One of the requirements for this roll out is that each Club have a recognised UAV Officer. The role of the UAV Officer would be to implement the required policies to our club, oversee the care and maintenance of the UAV and liaise with the SLSI UAV officer regarding training and policies.

Nominations for 2023-24 Season

The Committee calls for nominations from members for all positions for the 2023-24 season. Nominations will also be accepted off the floor on the day at the AGM. You can find descriptions of the roles in the Club By Laws, which you can access via SLS members portal (go to the Thirroul SLSC section of Library) or the Thirroul SLSC website.

As mentioned above, thanks to those involved for the specific grants that enabled us to carry out our building renovations. I would also like to thank SLS NSW and SLISA for the provision of grants that allow us to purchase much of our life saving equipment.

A full list of sponsors is available in this report and on behalf of Thirroul Surf Life Saving Club I would like to thank all our sponsors for their generosity in supporting our Club. Many of the sponsors, such as Austinmer-Thirroul Lions Club, Beaches Hotel Thirroul, Browns Accident Repair Centre, Byrne Surf Shop, Club Thirroul, Complete Hose, Grand Pacific Homes, IGA Thirroul, IMB, Ryans Hotel Thirroul and Thirroul Pharmacy have been with us for many years. Their sponsorship this year has gone into a range of projects from First Aid kits and Uniforms to sourcing a new multi-purpose trailer, to assistance with running the Dean Mercer Dash and the purchase of vital life saving equipment. We have also been fortunate this year to attract new sponsors such as Gordon Industries (deposit for new IRB), Horizon Bank (Transition Paddle Boards) and Thirroul Dental Care (Transition Paddle Board). Where possible I encourage all of our members to support the businesses that support our Club.

ADMINISTRATION REPORT

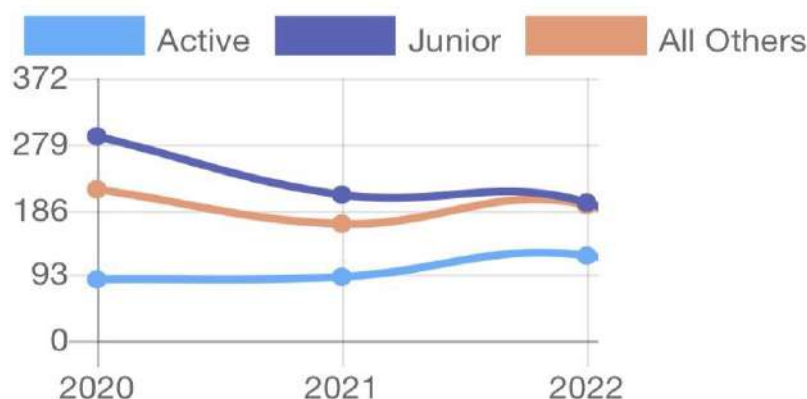

On behalf of the Board of Directors, I'm pleased to present the Annual Report of Thirroul Surf Life Saving Club Inc. for Season 2022/22.

In comparison with last season with COVID and the weather, the 2022/3 season felt like along with the rest of the country we were getting back to normality. Unfortunately as with many parts of life, we have seen a lasting impact on how people are now choosing to spend their time. Numbers were consistent with last season, but we had hoped to pick up and get back to pre COVID numbers.

This season, we had **121 active members** (up from 92), **194 Nippers / Juniors** (down from 208) and **191 other members** (up from 165). We are hoping next season will see an uptick as the junior club has seen some great success this season.



This season we say a sad farewell to Jen Norbury and Rod Bolton who will be stepping down as Junior Director and Treasurer respectively. Jen has put her heart and soul into the juniors for over 5 years and will be missed, but I'm sure we'll see her around and supporting the Chillaxes to reminisce about the good old days! Rod has done a sterling job and has guided the club through some difficult times with COVID and working tirelessly with Roy Wakelin-King and John Dryden on the building grants.

Now many aspects of the club are returning to normality, we will need to turn our attention to how we can make running, and in particular funding, a Surf Life Saving club sustainable. We are seeing the increasing costs and complexities of running the club increase year by year and we are also not immune from the cost of living crisis that everyone in the community is facing, with increasing costs and diminishing funds. We are grateful for all the support we get from our members and from our generous sponsors and also for the grants we receive.

LIFESAVING REPORT

Club Captain- Nadine Egan

Thank you to 121 patrolling members we have at Thirroul Surf Life Saving Club. This year has been a positive year on the beach.

Some statistics to ponder for the past season:

- 35,000 visitors to our beach
- 5,000 swimmers in our waters
- 240 preventative actions
- 34 rescues
- 20 first aid responses
- 15 rescues outside of the flags
- 2 missing persons reported and found.
- 1 report of lost property
- And 1 marine creature sighting

Our season has not been without controversy or action, however, each member of our 11 patrols has served the public and represented our club respectfully.

Emergency call out team – Kyle Mathiesen guided our emergency call out team this season with an information session to discuss the role and work shop previous emergency scenarios. Our club hopes to continue this reflective practice in the coming season. Emergency call outs were lower than previous years. The Illawarra Branch supported more training sessions with other emergency service organisations across the Illawarra to plan and showcase how services can work together in the search and rescue space.

In the coming season we hope to improve the distribution of awards across our patrols and improve the use of the Beach Safe app to increase communication of incidence, repair work and statistics through this app.

I would like to thank Anne Walton for being my vice club captain this past season, I could not have done this without her experience and beach knowledge. I am looking forward to a great season ahead on the beach with warm weather and serving the public so they can enjoy the beautiful playground Thirroul Beach offers.

Here's to a new patrol season filled with preventative actions and reflective practices to keep the public and our patrollers safe.

EDUCATION REPORT

Director of Education - Kim Shipton



I am pleased to present the annual report for Thirroul Surf Club's educational training program. Throughout the year 2022/2023, our focus remained on keeping our beaches safe by providing comprehensive training to our members. The training initiatives were designed to enhance the skills and knowledge of our personnel, with an emphasis on the Bronze Medallion, Surf Rescue, IRB Crew and Driver, as well as First Aid and Advanced First Aid.

Bronze Medallion Training

The Bronze Medallion training program continued to be a cornerstone of our educational efforts. We offered comprehensive training sessions that covered essential skills and knowledge in surf awareness, rescue techniques, first aid, and CPR. Our dedicated team of trainers worked diligently to ensure that all participants developed the necessary competencies to become proficient surf lifesavers, as a result Thirroul Surf Club trained **14 new Bronze Medallion** participants.

Surf Rescue Training

To further enhance our surf rescue capabilities, we conducted specialized surf rescue training sessions. These sessions focused on honing the skills required to respond effectively in various rescue scenarios, including both basic and complex rescues. The training emphasized teamwork, communication, and the use of appropriate equipment to ensure the safety of both rescuers and victims. This course was delivered during u14's nippers on Sundays with approx. **9 participants** who were assessed and now waiting on participants manuals to be returned.

IRB Crew and Driver Training

Recognizing the importance of Inflatable Rescue Boat (IRB) operations, we conducted thorough IRB Crew and Driver training programs. These sessions provided participants with the knowledge and skills required to safely and effectively operate IRBs during rescue operations. The training covered navigation, handling techniques, patient transfer, and general maintenance of the equipment. This season our IRB trainers assessed **9 crew participants** and increased the ratio of our IRB drivers award to an additional **6 participants**.

First Aid and Advanced First Aid

As part of our commitment to staying up to date with industry standards, we prioritised upskilling our key personnel in First Aid and Advanced First Aid. We aligned our training programs with the latest changes in the award, ensuring that our members were equipped with the most current knowledge and techniques. These courses covered a wide range of emergency medical situations, including managing spinal injuries, trauma, and providing effective emergency care. Thirroul had a great success in offering First aid to our members for the first time at the club in a long time, with **29 members** taking up the opportunity and **15 members upskilling** to the new Advanced Resuscitation Course.

Achievements and Impact

Through our educational training programs, Thirroul Surf Club has achieved several significant milestones:

1. **Increased Lifesaving Capacity:** The successful completion of the Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue training programs has expanded our pool of qualified surf lifesavers. This has significantly enhanced our ability to patrol and safeguard our local beaches, contributing to safer swimming conditions for the community.
2. **Improved Rescue Operations:** The IRB Crew and Driver training has empowered our members to conduct efficient and well-coordinated rescue operations using inflatable rescue boats. This has resulted in enhanced response times and increased success rates in rescuing individuals in distress.
3. **Enhanced Medical Expertise:** The focus on First Aid and Advanced First Aid training has equipped our personnel with the necessary skills to respond effectively to medical emergencies on the beach. This has improved our ability to provide immediate care and stabilise patients until further medical assistance arrives.

Future Outlook

Looking ahead, Thirroul Surf Club remains committed to providing high-quality educational training to our members. We will continue to adapt our programs to align with industry standards and best practices. In the coming year, we aim to further diversify our training offerings by introducing specialised courses in areas such as water safety, Beach Management, and advanced rescue techniques.

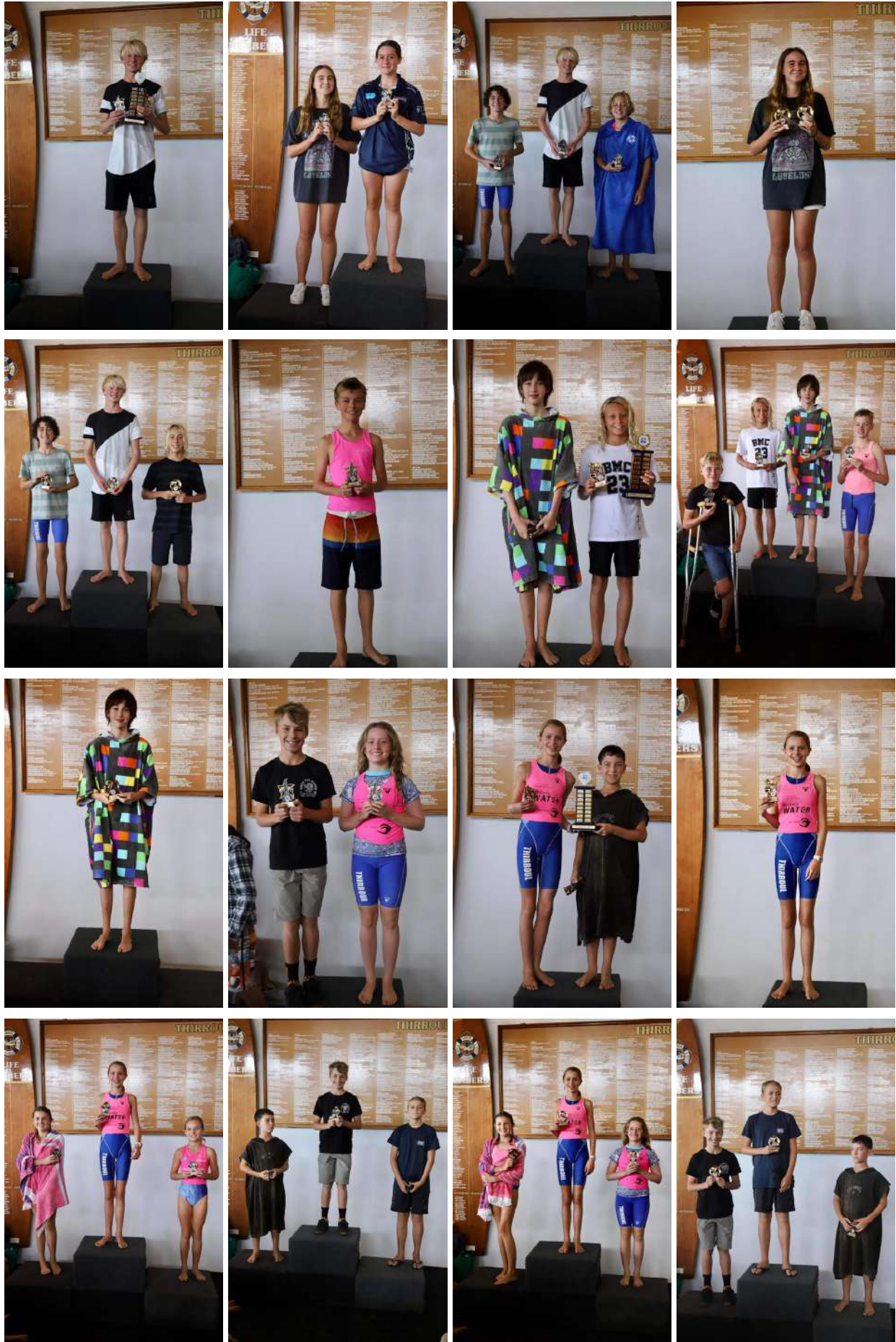

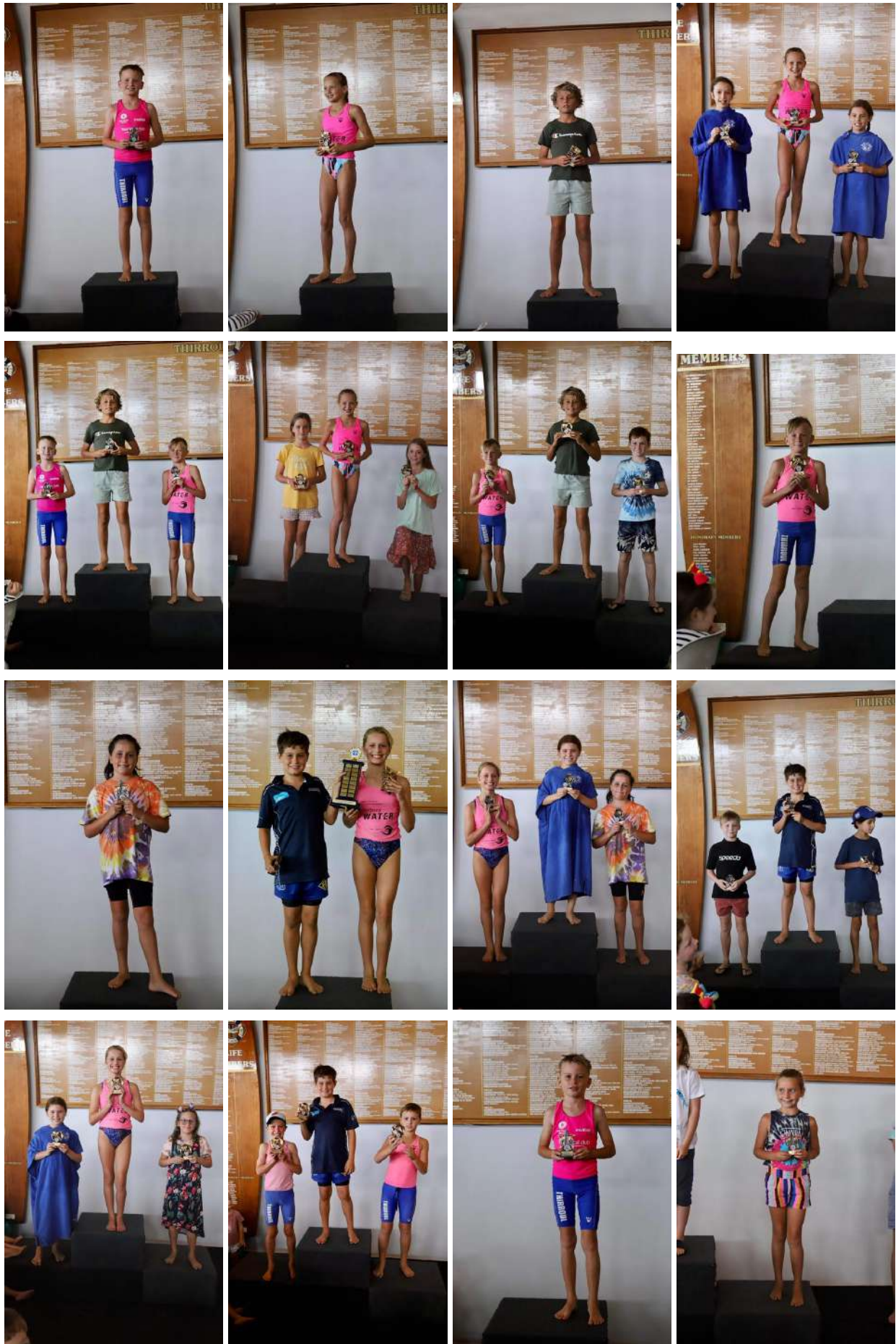

It's a festive morning when the *Flame* visits the Silver Salties at Thirroul Surf Club. Two of its members – Hagen Kreusser and Allan Hutton – are turning 70 and there's cake to celebrate.

There are also two giant cards, large-as-life portraits sketched by Col Bruton, 89.

Col – a former marathon surf ski paddler – is one of eight Life Members who have been drawn back into the surf club thanks to the Silver Salties.

The program is part of a nationwide Surf Life Saving initiative to promote fun, fitness and friendship for over-65s.

Co-ordinator Ian Sakoff – a former club captain at Thirroul SLSC – was inspired to start the social group after volunteering with Meals on Wheels.

Delivering food made him realise how many elderly people were sitting alone at home. One encounter stuck in his mind: "The lady who said, 'My son's coming to visit me – not this Friday, the Friday after, for one and a half hours'. It's just sad."

Thirroul's Silver Salties first met in January 2021. Now there are 30 people on the books, with about 20 turning up each week.

"They're loving it," Ian says. "So yes, I think it's changed them. There's a whole lot of older members that got re-involved with the club. Last year at our carnival, they helped out with the barbecue and they helped out presenting trophies. They just thought that was fantastic."

The Silver Salties group has not only brought old members back to the surf club, it's attracted new ones. "I would really like it to be offered to everyone," Ian says.

They like to keep things simple. "It is what it is. It's just go down the beach and have a chat, have a coffee," Ian says.

Sometimes the group splits in two. Some go on a walk, while the rest sit on the surf club's front veranda, read the papers and enjoy the view (today, there are dolphins).

The Salties – aged from their 60s to 90s – even have their own newsletter, *The Silver Salties Sentinel*, written and printed by Col Bruton. His reports provide an entertaining outlet for nine decades of memories of local life.

"All that info and history that he's got, it's getting used," Ian says. "It's really fantastic for Col. I hope I'm like that when I'm that age. There's a few there, all in their late 80s, and they're going really well."

"And that's the secret ... keep going."

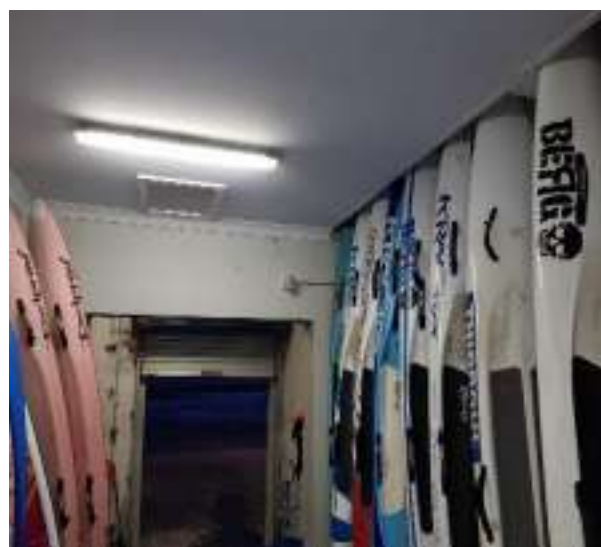

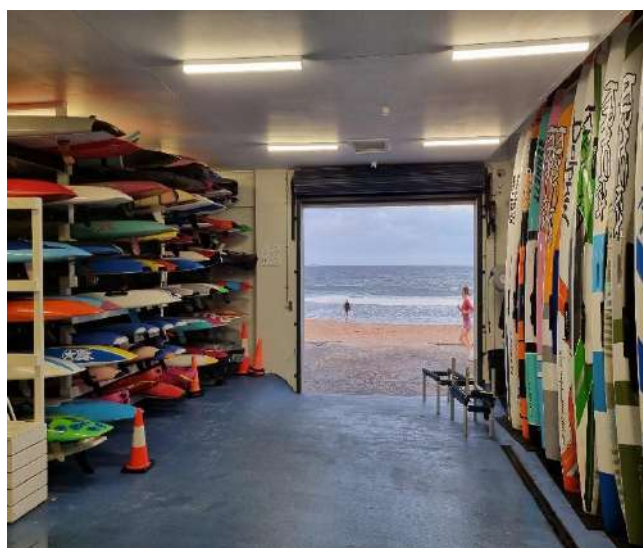

WORKPLACE HEALTH AND SAFETY REPORT

WHS Officer - Jeff Bōdy



During the 2022/23 season, the club demonstrated a commendable commitment to safety and well-being with no reported Workplace Health and Safety (WHS) incidents. The twelve monthly WHS check conducted on 09 September 2022 did not reveal any major issues, and continuous monitoring of all areas ensured that small to mild adjustments were promptly made to maintain a safe environment for the club members.

Specifically, adjustments were made to the storage of materials, such as chemicals and fuel, as well as surf craft access. The collaboration with the building committee proved effective in finding suitable and appropriate storage for equipment, including reaching points for heavy and light equipment. Moreover, the placement of craft was thoughtfully managed to prevent obstructions in walkways, exemplified by the improvement in ski storage within the trailer shed.

The club also demonstrated a proactive approach to safety by displaying Evacuation signage at strategic points around the building, ensuring that members and lessees were aware of procedures that met council standards. Regular safety checks performed by council third-party contractors on fire extinguishers and electricity outlets further reinforced the commitment to safety.

Looking ahead to the new season, the club has identified an opportunity for improvement in lifesaving equipment storage in the patrol shed for flags and beach signage. This initiative aims to minimise risks and maintain safe passage ways to the rear and sides of the patrol shed.

It is evident that members have been responsible when handling heavy equipment, such as tents and BBQs, ensuring that lifts are managed by at least two individuals. However, the club acknowledges the need to enhance the BBQ utensil wash-up area in terms of hygiene and storage.

The gym facility underwent significant changes, providing access to first aid and a defibrillator if needed. Signage for the correct use of equipment is visibly displayed, and hygiene sanitisation wipes are available for gym members. The club encourages vigilance among gym users, especially when dealing with heavy weights, to avoid injuries. Gym members were also reminded to return weights to appropriate storage heights after use.

Looking forward to the 2023 - 2024 season, the club plans to conduct an electrical safety audit in collaboration with the building committee to ensure the safety of all members and guests.

In conclusion, the club has shown a proactive and responsible approach to health and safety during the 2022/23 season. By addressing various aspects of safety, implementing necessary adjustments, and planning for further audits and improvements, the club continues to maintain a safe environment for everyone involved. The club expresses gratitude to all members for their vigilance in reporting any issues, contributing to the collective effort in creating a safe club environment.

FINANCE REPORT

Director of Finance - Rod Bolton



The financial year ending 30 April 2023 was a busy year with much activity across patrols, education, nippers, events, training, competitions, hall functions and gym.

For the financial year ending 30 April 2023, the Club generated a reported loss of \$35,272 which includes a non-cash depreciation charge of \$78,163.

The Club generated income totalling \$166,301 for the year. The Club's biggest source of income was the Functions Hall (\$49,629). Registration Fees were the second biggest item (\$35,452). Other fee items included gym fees, board storage fees, access keys and competition fees. The Club received grants from Surf Life Saving NSW (\$6,100) and Surf Life Saving Australia Beach Safety Equipment Fund (\$10,000). The Club also benefited from some generous donations: Greater Bank, Thirroul Uniting Church Quilt Makers, Horizon Bank, Complete Hose, Gordon Brothers Industries, Browns Accident Repairs, All Shire Roofing, Thirroul Dental and Thirroul Pharmacy.

A very special donation was received in memory of the Late John "Zochy" Wilson which went towards the manufacture of the new nippers mobile rack.

Other items of revenue span Bar Sales, BBQ's, Dean Mercer Dash, Presentation Night, Clothing and Uniforms, High Tea By the Sea, Envirobank and the Club's agreement with Wollongong Council.

In terms of the application of funds, expenses totalled \$201,573 comprising accrued actual expenses of \$123,410 and non-cash depreciation expense of \$78,163. The various expense categories are detailed in the financial statements.

It is worth noting that the Committee decided to write down the value of some uniform stock due to obsolescence. The write down related to some Cannibal (16/17 \$2,872) and Kozzi (18/19 \$3,509) remaining stock items.

Total funds applied to property and equipment was \$55,085 comprising gym equipment, building, boards, board rack and trailer.

The end of year cash balance was \$127,116, which reflects a decrease of \$6,930 over the year.



Fundraising Distributions

We acknowledge The Surf Life Saving Foundation for conducting fundraising on behalf of clubs and branches. Conducting fundraising efforts centrally frees up member time to focus their energies and resources on lifesaving activities – our number one mission. It also helps to ensure greater equity of funding across the state. We also acknowledge the generous support of the general public and all our donors.

This support enables us to run our club and save lives. This year we have purchased rescue gear and equipment; recruited and trained surf lifesavers and nippers; and completed core upgrades to our facilities.

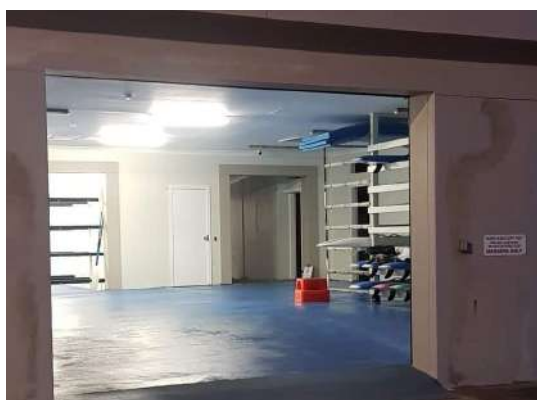

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act NSW, the *Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission Act 2012* and the *Charitable Fundraising Act 1991*. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity. The entity is a not-for-profit entity domiciled in Australia.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies which are consistent with the previous period, unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

The special purpose financial report has been prepared in accordance with the recognition, measurement and classification aspects of all applicable Australian Accounting Standards ("AASBs") (including Australian Accounting Interpretations) adopted by the Australian Accounting Standards Board (AASB) and the Australian Charities and Not-For-Profit Commission and the disclosure requirements of Accounting Standards AASB 101 'Presentation of Financial Statements', 'AASB 107 'Statement of Cash Flows', AASB 108 'Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors', AASB 1048 'Interpretation of Standards' and AASB 1054 'Australian Additional Disclosures'.

Revenue

Donations and bequests are recognised as revenue when received, unless they are designated for a specific purpose, where they are carried forward as prepaid income on the balance sheet.

Interest revenue and distribution income from investments are recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

Revenue from the rendering of a service is recognised upon the delivery of the service to the customers.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and current replacement cost.

Inventories acquired at no cost, or for nominal consideration are valued at the current replacement cost as at the date of acquisition.

Income Tax

The association is, for income tax purposes, a Charitable Institution. Its income is therefore, exempt from income tax under Section 50.1 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

Fixed Assets

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less any accumulated depreciation where applicable.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

Useful lives of Property, Plant & Equipment

The Entity reviews the estimated useful lives of property, plant and equipment at the end of each annual reporting period.

Comparative Figures

Where required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation of the current financial year.

Estimates and judgements

The preparation of the financial statements required management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised and in any future periods affected.

Information about significant areas of estimation uncertainty and critical judgements in applying accounting policies that have the most significant effect on the amounts in the financial statements are included in the following notes.

Key Estimates

Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic

Judgement has been exercised in considering the impacts that the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic has had, or may have, on the the Club based on known information. This consideration extends to the nature of the products and services offered, customers, supply chain, staffing and LGA in which the Club operates. Other than as addressed in specific notes, there does not currently appear to be either any significant impact upon the financial statements or any significant uncertainties with respect to events or conditions which may impact the incorporated association unfavourably as at the reporting date or subsequently as a result of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic.

INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT

Qualified Opinion

I have audited the financial report of Thirroul Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated ("the Entity"), which comprises the balance sheet as at 30 April 2023, the income statement, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies, and the declaration by the Management Committee.

In my opinion, except for the effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion section, the accompanying financial report of the Entity is in accordance with Division 60 of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission Act 2012*, including:

- a) giving a true and fair view of the Entity's financial position as at 30 April 2023 and of its financial performance for the year then ended; and
- b) complying with Australian Accounting Standards to the extent described in Note 1 and Division 60 of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Regulation 2013*.

Basis of Qualified Opinion

As is common for organisations of this type, it is not practicable to maintain an effective system of internal control over donations, subscriptions and other fund raising activities until their initial entry on the accounting records. Accordingly, our audit in relation to fundraising was limited to the amounts recorded.

The Entity's inventories are carried in the statement of financial position at \$14,505 (2022: \$14,981.) This is a Committee's valuation based on a report prepared by the Entity. I was unable to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence about the balance of inventory at 30 April 2023 because we did not attend the stock take.

I conducted my audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. My responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report section of my report. I am independent of the Entity in accordance with the auditor independence requirements of the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's APES 110 Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants ("the Code") that are relevant to my audit of the financial report in Australia. I have also fulfilled my other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code.

I confirm that the independence declaration required by Division 60 of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012*, which has been given to the Management Committee, would be in the same terms if given as at the time of this auditor's report.

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my opinion.

Basis of Accounting

Without modifying our opinion, we draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared to assist Thirroul Surf Life Saving Club Inc to meet the requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Act NSW* and the *Charitable Fundraising Act* for the purpose of fulfilling the committee's financial reporting responsibilities. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.

Responsibilities of Management Committee for the Financial Report

Management is responsible for the preparation of the special purpose financial report that gives a true and fair view in accordance with the relevant Australian Accounting Standards in accordance with the *Australian Charities and Not-for Profits Commission Regulations 2013* and the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012* and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of the financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the special purpose financial report, management is responsible for assessing the Entity's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intend to liquidate the Entity or to cease operations, or have no realistic alternative but to do so.

The Management Committee are responsible for overseeing the Entity's financial reporting process.
